Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina said, the government has been equipping BGB with state-of-the-art technology to ensure foolproof security at the frontiers and tackle transnational crimes. The Prime Minister said this while addressing at a function marking the Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) Day- at Bir Uttam Anwar Hossain Parade Ground at BGB Headquarters in the capital yesterday. Her government has set up a rudder at Shahparir Dweep in Teknaf of Cox's Bazar to enhance surveillance across the Bangladesh border with Myanmar, the Prime Minister added.

Later, Prime Minister reiterated that the forcibly displaced Rohingyas must be returned to their own country, Myanmar in a dignified manner. Sheikh Hasina said this when the Lawyer of Bangladesh to the International Court of Justice (ICJ) on climate change Dr. Payam Akhavan called on her at her Sangsad Bhaban office yesterday. The Prime Minister also reiterated Bangladesh's stance not to allow anybody to use its territory for any kind of insurgency, Prime Minister's Speechwriter Md. Nazrul Islam briefed reporters after the call on.

Agriculture Minister Dr. Md. Abdus Shahid sought cooperation from the Deputy Commissioners (DCs) to bring all barren lands under cultivation. The Minister said this while addressing a session of the Deputy Commissioners Conference at the Osmani Memorial Auditorium in the capital yesterday. Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has given directives to bring all barren lands under cultivation. According to her directives, steps have already been taken to bring all unused lands of sugar mills, jute mills, textiles mills and railways under cultivation, the Minister added.

Textile Minister also laid importance on diversification of jute products and attractive designs to attract the buyers as Prime Minister Sheikh Ilasina has been providing all out support in this regard.

Industries Minister Nurul Majid Mahmud Humayun asked Deputy Commissioners (DCs) to prepare a list of Geographical Indication (GI) products.
