Hon'ble Prime Minister: Help for dignified repatriation of Rohingyas

Hon. Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, reiterated her call for global assistance at the IX Moscow Conference on International Security to ensure dignified and peaceful repatriation of the Rohingyas as they are posing a huge security threat to Bangladesh as well as for the region underlining that Bangladesh has been hosting more than 1.1 million forcibly displaced Myanmar nationals-Rohingyas for about four years. In her pre-recorded message the Premier also put emphasis on ensuring vaccination to all to fight COVID-19, humanitarian assistance to the marginalized people, safe return of all Rohingyas to Myanmar, stopping financing and supply of arms to terrorists and increasing cooperation among military agencies to ensure global security.

The Premier said that her government's planned measures for the country's development have put Bangladesh as one of the top three performers on the Sustainable Development Goals-SDGs Index score.


Prime Minister hands over 53,340 more houses to landless families

Besides, 100,000 more houses will be given by December 2021 as part of the government's move to rehabilitate the country's homeless people.

NAM should initiate concrete actions for the Palestinian crisis: HFM

Movement-NAM to redouble its efforts for a just, durable and peaceful solution to the long-lingering Palestine crisis. While virtually addressing an extraordinary meeting, of the NAM Committee on Palestine, Dr. Momen reiterated Bangladesh's solidarity and continued commitment in support of the inalienable rights of the Palestinians to determination, independence, statehood and sovereignty. At the same time, the Minister urged the Movement to ensure urgent humanitarian assistance and COVID-19 vaccines to the Palestinian people.

Government updates 'Bangladesh Climate Change Strategy and Action Plan'

Bangladesh government has updated the 'Bangladesh Climate Change Strategy and Action Plan' to adapt to climate change and set up a 'Bangladesh Climate Change Trust Fund' with its own funding and various government and nongovernment projects are being implemented in the country with the fund. Besides, the government has also made a 'National Adaptation Plan Implementation Roadmap' and received US\$2.55 million from the Green Climate Fund for the National Adaptation Plan Process Formulation.

Bangladesh eyes 40% renewable energy by 2041

State Minister for Power, Energy and Mineral Resources Nasrul Hamid has said that 40% of electricity in Bangladesh will come from renewable sources by 2041. The strategy was adopted in the country's Power System Master Plan (PSMP). Already about 2 crore rural people were brought under the electrification facilities through 58 lakh solar home systems and the development plan and strategy was taken up giving priority to the sustainable development goals.

Bangladesh to introduce COVID-19 vaccine passport

Bangladesh government is planning to introduce a COVID-19 vaccine passport through the Surokkha digital platform in order to facilitate overseas travel. This app will help people to travel to foreign countries that allow only vaccinated passengers. The government has also decided to include the outbound expatriate Bangladeshi workers in the priority list for getting COVID-19 shot.

UNESCO-2005 convention: Bangladesh elected inter-state committee member

Bangladesh has been elected interstate committee member of UNESCO 2005 Convention for the Protection and Promotion of the Diversity of Cultural

Expressions for the period 2021-2025 for the first time. The election was

the member states of the convention on 1-4 June 2021. It is to be noted that the "UNESCO-Bangladesh Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Interactional Award for creative Economics" will be provided for the first time at the 41st General Assembly of UNESCO to be held in November 2021.

Bangladesh elected vice-president of 76th **UNGA** session

Bangladesh has been elected vice president for the upcoming 76th Session of the UN General Assembly from the Asia Pacific Region for a one-year term, beginning from September 2021. The election was held at the UN General Assembly (UNGA) in June 2021 where Bangladesh was elected unanimously. Along with Bangladesh, Kuwait, the Lao People's Democratic Republic and the Philippines have also been elected as vice presidents from Asia Pacific Region.

Bangladesh reelected as deputy member of ILO's governing body

Bangladesh has been re-elected for

the third time as a Deputy Member of the Governing Body of the International Labour



Organization-ILO from the Asia-Pacific region for the term 2021-2024, in an election virtually held in Geneva during the 109th International Labour Conference-ILC with the highest 210 votes.

Report: Bangladesh among performers in sustainable development

Bangladesh and two other Countries-Afghanistan and Cote d'Ivoire, have progressed the most on the SDGs Index score



since the adoption of the 2030 global agenda in 2015, according to the Sustainable Development Report 2021, launched by the Sustainable

Development Solution Network-SDSN. Besides, Bangladesh ranked 109th on the SDG Index 2021 and ahead of its other South Asian neighbors like India (120th), Pakistan (129th) and Afghanistan (137th).

BGMEA wins prestigious green award

Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers **Exporters**

and Association-BGMEA, as the first organization in the world, has been





awarded the prestigious '2021 Leadership Award' by the United States Green Building Council-USGBC for the Association's efforts for building a green garment sector. Currently, Bangladesh has 143 Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design LEEDcertified garment factories, the highest in the world. Of the top 10 LEED-certified buildings, nine are in Bangladesh, which reflects the country's efforts to follow good practices for saving the environment during production.

Foreign exchange reserves set a new record of US\$46 billion



Bangladesh Bank data showed that Bangladesh's foreign exchange reserves have set a new record of US\$46 billion.

\$47m additional Korean loan for water supply project

A loan agreement was signed in June 2021 under which South Korea would provide a US\$47 million soft loans to Bangladesh for the "Bhandal Jhuri Water Supply Project" to be implemented by Chattogram Water Supply and Sewerage Authority (CWASA).
