## UN honours 8 fallen peacekeepers from Bangladesh



The United Nations has awarded eight fallen peacekeepers from Bangladesh posthumously with 'Dag Hammarskjöld

Medal'. At a virtual ceremony on the occasion of the International Day of the UN Peacekeepers, as many as 129 peacekeepers from 44 nations who lost their lives while rendering duties in different peacekeeping missions in 2020 were honoured. Among the 129, eight were Bangladeshi peacekeepers, a figure which is the highest from any single country this year. This medal commemorates the strength, purity and fragility of the lives lost in the cause of peace.

#### Bangladesh urges the UN Security Council to address the Palestinian issue



Foreign Minister Dr. A K Abdul Momen while reiterating Bangladesh's position in the open-ended meeting of the OIC Executive Committee held on a virtual platform, said that the country believes in a comprehensive and durable solution to the Palestinian issue in accordance with the relevant UN resolutions, the Arab Peace Initiative and the Quarter Road Map. He said that as the principal organ of the UN charged with ensuring international peace and security, the UN Security Council should take up the issue of violence and breach of security in the Al-Quds Al-Shareef and the entire occupied land of the State of Palestine.

## UN issues stamps marking UN Peacekeepers Day, birth centenary of Bangabandhu

On the occasion of the '2021 International Day of the United Nations Peacekeepers (Peacekeepers Day)' the UN Postal Administration on May 29, jointly with the Permanent Mission of Bangladesh to the UN in New York, issued a set of commemorative stamps. It was a tribute to UN peacekeepers and marking the Birth Centenary of the Father of the Nation of Bangladesh, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman.

The commemorative stamp folio features Bangladesh's flag, logo of MUJIB 100, portrait of Bangabandhu and images of UN Peacekeeping services around the world.

He also informed the panel about Bangladesh's adoption of a unique 'Delta Plan-2100' that conforms to the five P4G focus areas and that illustrates Bangladesh's commitment to the global goals towards green development.

## China assures Bangladesh of vaccine's 'stable supply'

Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi during his telephone conversation with

His counterpart in Bangladesh Dr. A K Abdul Momen, gave the assurance that it will provide all cooperation for keeping a 'stable supply' of Chinese vaccine to Bangladesh and the country is willing to facilitate the discussion of cooperation in 'vaccine filling' between Bangladesh and Chinese companies.

At the request of Dr. Momen, Wang Yi also announced that China has decided to provide 6 lacs more COVID-19 vaccine doses to Bangladesh as the second batch of gifts.

#### Bangladesh urges Canada to send 2 million doses of COVID vaccine

Bangladesh urged Canada to send at least two million doses of AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine to Bangladesh directly to meet up immediate second dose vaccine requirements in the country, when the Canadian High Commissioner in Bangladesh called on Foreign Minister Dr. A K Abdul Momen at the

Ministry. He also sought Canadian help in vaccinating the displaced Rohingyas in Bangladesh separately.

## Prime Minister donates Tk 10cr privately for Covid-19 affected, homeless people

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina privately donated Taka 10 crore from Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Memorial Trust for the

#### Dhaka to host World Peace Conference in November

Bangladesh will host a two-day world peace conference in November this year, marking the ongoing birth centenary celebrations of Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman as part of promoting a culture of peace and tolerance. Bangabandhu Peace Award will be introduced and conferred during the conference. A committee has been formed to successfully hold the event he added.

## Bangladesh emphasizes permanent Rohingya solution in launching JRP 2021

Bangladesh has urged the United Nations and the



International community to deepen their efforts in finding a permanent solution to the Rohingya crisis. State

#### US, UK govts co-fund project to reduce river pollution in Dhaka

The USA and the UK have cofounded an advocacy project called "Promoting Democratic Governance and Collective Advocacy for Environmental Protection in Dhaka City," with the Dhaka North and South City Corporations to reduce different rivers pollution in Dhaka district. The new anti-pollution advocacy project was developed by Water-keepers Bangladesh Consortium and in collaboration with Counterpart International, co-funded by the USAID and the UK's Foreign Commonwealth, and Development Office designed to advocate for clean Dhaka Rivers.

#### ILO lauds Bangladesh's progress in RMG

International Labour Organisation-ILO Country Director in Bangladesh Tuomo Poutiainen has praised the development that the RMG sector has made in the areas of workplace safety and social compliance. A delegation of the ILO led by its Country Director held a meeting with BGMEA President Faruque Hassan at his office and discussed the possible avenues of collaboration, especially on the well-being of the workers'.

## Remittance flow and Forex reserves hit a record high

The country's inward remittance flow witnesses 39 percent growth during the first 10 months of the current fiscal 2020-21, with US\$20,672 million remittances. Also, Bangladesh Bank informed that the country's foreign exchange reserves hit a new record with US\$ 45.11 billion.

## More than 53,500 homeless and landless to get a new house by June

Another 53,500 homeless and landless people will get new houses by June this year and 1.25 lac more others by next year under the Mujib Borsho Ashrayan Project. The decision came at a recent meeting at the Prime Minister's Office-PMO. Earlier, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina announced that her government would ensure shelters for all marking the Mujib Borsho.


Ambassador Abida Islam held a meeting with the Hon'ble Chair and Members of the Korea-Bangladesh Parliamentary
