Celebrating Historic 7 March, 2021

Bangladesh High Commission, Mauritius observed the Historic 7 March, 2021 with due solemnity and fervor. To commemorate the day, H.E. the High Commissioner, Ms. Rezina Ahmed hoisted the National Flag, laid wreath at the portrait of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu, Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. Besides, discussion and supplement were published in relation to this event. Later on the messages by the Hon'ble President, the Hon'ble Prime Minister were read out.

Recently, Bangladesh has fulfilled all the criteria for graduation from the world's least developed countries, hence we have to work hard under the leadership of the Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina to become a developed nation by the year 2041. She added that Bangladesh's battle against Covid-19 was commended by all over the world. It was appended that till date over 7 million people have been vaccinated and by next June, Bangladesh will receive 1 crore 9 lac vaccines, which has been approved by the World Health Organization.
